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Recently we had a strategic planning meeting with Cal Vet and your executive board was in attendance. Numerous topics were discussed.

The College Fee Waiver (CFW) was the first topic. It was decided that there is no time limit on the proof of disability from the VA. Old letters showing a disability rating will be good in perpetuity. Also the wording of the CFW manual is still being revised by the legal department of CalVet prior to releasing it for review. We have our consultant Jack Kirwan submitting language and we will get to review the proposed language prior to submission to the legislature. CalVet is also working on funding for the 1-800 number for CVSO's and increasing Vet Pro Maintenance Fees. This money will come out of the VSOF or license plate money. The fund is in good shape due to increased sales and a fee increase. Discussion was help regarding changing the Vet Plates back to the inscription of veteran rather than honoring veterans. CalVet is looking into it.

CalVet got to hire new positions to process MC-5's. This person will get thousands of them and do some outreach to the veterans. If you want the MC-5's sent directly to your office instead of CalVet working them, please let Angela know. If you do get them, then CalVet would expect a serious outreach effort and not simply a verification of benefits. Decision Ready Claims (DRC) was discussed and if you are interested in this process, you should contact your district office and sign up for training. You would have to have VBMS access to use this process. CalVet is still working on the language for the procedure manual and medi-cal cost avoidance manual. It should be out soon.

The mentoring process was discussed and several offices have asked for mentoring. This process has started already and anyone wanting another set of eyes on their operation can call Tom Splitgerber, our executive director and he will set up a visit from an experienced CVSO. This program is all positive and meant to help new CVSO's and people who want help with any type of problems they may have. CalVet and our association will work to get the February conference in Sacramento to include two levels of training, one level for experienced CVSO's and one for new vet reps and CVSO's. New people are sometimes lost in the jargon and acronyms. I remember the first two years of my career where I did not understand anything that was being talked about at the conference.

A discussion was held about including National Guard and Reserve 20 year career service members as veterans in the License Plate Program. No resolution was made regarding this topic. Bergman and Moore law firm will give us all training at the Riverside Conference on how to appeal BVA decisions that are denied or not fully granted. This will give another avenue of appeal when the decision is not to our liking. See you all in Riverside. We will have elections as the first order of business at 10:00 on Monday. Please plan to be there and have some ideas on who you want to nominate. We have vacancies in President, 1st VP, 2nd VP, Sgt. at Arms and several trustee positions. We need new blood on the executive board with a mixture of experienced members.

AB 153 AUTHOR: Chavez [R]

TITLE: Military Fraud

Summary: Requires certain elected officers to forfeit their office upon the conviction of a crime pursuant to the federal Stolen Valor Act or the California Stolen Valor Act that involves a fraudulent claim, made with the intent to obtain money, property, or other tangible benefit, that the person is a veteran or a member of the Armed Forces. Provides for penalties.

AB 296 **AUTHOR:** Cervantes [D]

TITLE: Task Force: Health of Women Veterans

SUMMARY: Requires the Department of Veterans Affairs to create a task force to study the health of California women veterans comprised of members with specified qualifications. Prohibits task force from receiving compensation or reimbursement of expense for their service. Requires the task force to study the health care needs of women veterans in the state. Requires the task force to submit reports to the Governor.

AB 363 **AUTHOR:** Quirk-Silva [D]

TITLE: Drivers Licenses: Veteran Designation

Summary: Prohibits a fee from being charged for requests to have the word VETERAN printed on driver's licenses and identification cards, if made by a person who has been determined to have a specified income level or a person who can verify his or her status as a homeless person.

AB 365 **AUTHOR:** Muratsuchi [D]

TITLE: Pupil Instruction: Coursework and Graduation

SUMMARY: Amends an existing law which requires a school district to exempt certain pupils from coursework

Support and other requirements in certain cases. Extends the exemption to children of military families.

AB 547 AUTHOR: Chavez [R]

California Prompt Payment Act: Disabled Veterans

SUMMARY: Requires state agencies to pay an undisputed invoice from a certified disabled veteran business enterprise that is also a small business within a certain period of initial receipt. Requires a state agency to submit a claim on an undisputed invoice to the Controller for payment within a certain period. Requires the agency to pay penalties if it fails to submit a correct

Support claim schedule.

TITLE: Mobilehome Residents and Senior Protection Act

SUMMARY: Extends the application of certain enforcement procedures for the prevention and elimination of housing discrimination to apply to unlawful actions under the Mobilehome Residency Law against homeowners or residents of mobilehomes. Authorizes the Department of Fair Employment and Housing to investigate potential violations of the Mobilehome Residency Law that are discovered during the course of an existing formal investigation, without a formal complaint.

TITLE: Military and Overseas Voters

Summary: Authorizes a military or overseas voter to apply in person to the elections official for permission to register if he or she is released from services after the closing date of registration for an election, has returned to the county of his or her residence, and is not a registered voter. Allows a military or overseas voter who is required to move under official active duty military orders after the closing date of registration to apply in person after the closing date of registration.

TITLE: Veterans and Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2018

SUMMARY: Enacts the Veterans and Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2018. Authorizes the issuance of bonds of a specified amount to be used to finance various existing housing programs, as well as infill infrastructure financing and affordable housing matching grant programs. Provides for additional funding of a specified amount for farm purchase, home purchase, and mobilehome purchase assistance for veterans.
